

LOUIS J. DUVEEN **DIES IN LONDON**

**England Representative of Art
Firm Expires After an Opera-
tion—Expert on Italian Art.**

LONDON, March 4.—Louis J. Duveen, the London representative of the art firm of Duveen Brothers, died here today. Death followed an operation.

Sir Joseph Duveen said last night at the Hotel Plaza:

"The death of my younger brother came entirely unexpectedly. Two days ago I had a cable from him saying he was going to have a slight operation. There was no indication of danger whatever.

"He was the expert among the members of our firm on Italian painting and sculpture. He was in charge of the London house, on Grafton Street, and bought for us most of the large English collections secured by the house in recent years.

"He was a nephew of the late Sir Joseph Duveen. He was 45 years old. His wife was Miss Beatrice Slowman of London. They have four children and live in Barclay Square.

"Although he was a member of the firm that controls our business in New York, he had had little active connection with our affairs on this side."
